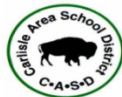

COLD WEATHER GUIDELINES FOR RECESS & OUTDOOR PHYSICAL ACTIVITY

Carlisle Area School District uses the following cold weather guidelines to decide if it is acceptable to have outdoor recess.

- When properly clothed, elementary school-aged children can participate in safe, vigorous play in an outdoor environment in most weather conditions. Increased caution is practiced when temperatures are below 30 degrees, including the wind chill factor.

- When temperatures fall below 20 degrees including the wind chill, students are kept indoors (using "feels like" temperature).

COLD WEATHER REMINDERS

Cold temperatures and blustery winds are here! Please remember to send your student to school dressed for the weather - layers work best! **Please check our Lost & Found located in the lobby if your child loses or misplaces an item.** Lost & Found items will be donated to a local charity during the holiday breaks and at the end of the year.

WINTER WEATHER MESSAGE FROM CARLISLE ARE SCHOOL DISTRICT

The winter weather can create a real challenge, with school administrators trying to determine the best forecasts for delaying or canceling school. School administrators and bus company representatives begin traveling district roadways between 4:00 and 4:30AM to review actual road conditions. In addition to this review, contacts are made with the local road crews on the status of road conditions and what procedures (treating, plowing) are being implemented. The school facilities director is also involved in discussions about the conditions at the school bus unloading, parking areas and sidewalks. Based on this information and the latest weather forecast, a decision is made by approximately 5:00AM. The local radio and television stations are contacted and instructed to make the appropriate announcement. The parent notification system will also be activated to inform those parents who have supplied the district with information to participate in these alerts. The task is never easy; many factors can impact the decision such as the changing road conditions and weather forecasts for our immediate area that can be very unpredictable. The district considers the safety of all of the children riding school buses, driving, and walking to school, and asks for your patience as we deal with the winter weather. During inclement weather students should wait at their bus stop for 25 minutes before returning home.

SAFETY AND SECURITY: VISITORS PLEASE SIGN-IN

VISITORS PLEASE COMPLETE SIGN-IN PROCESS WITH EACH VISIT: REMEMBER TO BRING YOUR ID EACH TIME YOU VISIT

In the interest of the safety and security of our students and staff, the Carlisle Area School District uses a visitor management system. The visitor management system

provides the District with the ability to keep an up-to-date verified log of visitors. Visitors include parents/guardians and volunteers who are given access to schools when school is in session.

All visitors will be required to present a photo identification card (every visit), preferably a valid, state-issued driver's license, or other photo identification, to the front office personnel before entry to the school is granted. The ID will be scanned using the visitor management system.

This procedure applies when school is in session:

- Pick-up an elementary or middle school student
- Gain access to the school beyond the office or the front door/window when necessary
- Attend an event on district property such as concerts, plays, field day, etc.

If a person does not have a valid state issued driver's license, an alternate form of photo identification such as a military ID, passport, or other government issued ID will need to be provided. The visitor management system will conduct a background check using a national sex offender database.

The school will be equipped to scan the ID and take the visitor's photo to create a badge for any visitor that requires access to the school. This system has the ability to provide alerts on individuals who may jeopardize the safety of students or staff. Once entry is granted, the visitor management system will print a badge that identifies the visitor, the date, time, photograph, and the destination of the visitor. Visitors must return to the office to return the badge and check out of the system upon leaving the school.

INFO SNAP

The District sent parents/guardians instructions to complete required online forms via **InfoSnap**. The sooner we receive this information, the better prepared we are to provide services to your child. **Please complete the Infosnap process as soon as possible.**

OUR EXPECTATIONS

- Complete daily classroom assignments and homework

VOLUNTEERS/CLEARANCES

Parents are encouraged to volunteer at school. On July 16, 2015 the Carlisle Area School District Board of Directors approved Volunteer Policy #916. This policy is in accordance with the Child Protective Services law.

Volunteers - Please review the application/check list accessible through the Carlisle Area School District link below. Volunteers must complete all requirements prior to any volunteer activity in a school or on a field trip. It is important to understand who is a volunteer. The district requires all clearances to be turned in at least *one week* prior to any volunteer activity.

Please note that volunteers must renew clearances at least every five (5) years to remain eligible as a volunteer. Volunteer clearances are "portable" provided they are not out of date.

SCHOOL ZONE SAFETY RULES

- *Avoid walking/driving through the parking lot. Parking is by permit only.
- *Avoid double parking.
- *Avoid parking in (yellow curbed) bus zone. Avoid idling.
- *Exit car to sidewalk, not street-side.
- *Be a good neighbor and respect neighborhood properties by not blocking driveways or littering.
- *Walk on sidewalk, not street.
- *Cross at crosswalks.
- *When biking to school, **wear a helmet** - it's the law!
- *Follow bus rules.
- *Special note to parents: avoid texting/talking on cell phones in school zone.
- *In an effort to promote wellness, reduce traffic congestion, and ensure safety, we encourage students within walking distance to walk to and from school.
